

In Crises like COVID-19, Women and Girls Bear the Brunt

The COVID-19 pandemic has created months of uncertainty. But there's one thing we know for sure ...

"We know that when emergencies hit, women and girls come last," says CARE Humanitarian Policy Director Susannah Friedman.



Your support ensures that women and girls are kept at the center of CARE's emergency response programs, in addition to our long-term education and empowerment initiatives.

But thanks to supporters like you, CARE puts women and girls first in emergency situations. Here's why we've made that our mission - and why your generosity is so important.

Women and girls are at increased risk of gender**based violence.** We learned from previous outbreaks of Ebola that when schools closed due to the guarantine, teenage pregnancies spiked because young women were increasingly vulnerable to assault. The guarantine also led to a decrease in support services for women facing domestic abuse.

Hygiene products are harder to come by. Many women and girls are already dependent upon humanitarian agencies for sanitary supplies and menstrual products. When disease disrupts such services, price gouging and panic buying make such necessities nearly impossible to obtain.

Women and girls are the first to feel food insecurity. During public health emergencies, women and girls are the first to go hungry. In many countries, custom dictates that they eat last and least. What's more, as food becomes scarce, prices skyrocket - often forcing women and girls into transactional sex.

Social norms and caregiving expose women and girls to greater health risks. Because 70% of caregivers worldwide are female, they are more vulnerable to disease transmission at home and at work. Conversely, during an outbreak, they're less likely to get the basic healthcare they need, as medical resources are diverted to managing the emergency.

With your help, CARE is scaling up its efforts to prevent gender-based violence and provide support for survivors. We're also re-enforcing critical health services for women and girls and educating and empowering frontline health workers – most of whom are women. Together, we're fighting for equality and social justice!

In Sierra Leone, **Courage Comes to the Rescue**

Rosaline is worried. As a nurse in Sierra Leone, she worked the front lines during the Ebola outbreak in 2015. Today, she is at the center of the tiny country's fight against COVID-19.

The fast-changing pandemic is confusing. Her people are afraid. They're not sure whom to trust. But they trust Rosaline.

"We have set up handwashing stations at every public place — in community gathering places, in schools, at the health facility, everywhere," she says.

And people are listening; they are taking precautions. They are staving home and avoiding night clubs, sports venues and social groups.

But Rosaline can't stay home.

"I take my motorcycle and go out to the communities," she says. "I sit with them to explain this new virus and how they should protect themselves. They trust me, because I was born in this area and they know me."

Though her actions seem fearless. Rosaline knows her work is dangerous.

"We are worried, because it will affect us as health workers," she explains. "We are the front-liners, because we touch patients, we receive patients, so we worry a lot. ... This is a very dangerous disease."

With your help, CARE has provided personal protective equipment for courageous health workers like Rosaline. That means she can stay safe while she keeps her community healthy. And that means the people of Sierra Leone

have compassionate, experienced health care to count on in the face of this terrifying disease.

Because of you, Rosaline is hopeful. She's cautious about the situation, but she goes to work each day with a confidence she didn't feel years ago.

"During Ebola, many of us health workers died," she recalls. "But if this disease strikes in Sierra Leone. we will follow our protocols from the start. Nurses won't die like we did before."

Bringing Health and Hope to the World's Largest **Refugee Camp**



Cox's Bazaar is a town on Bangladesh's southeast coast. once known for its sandy beachfront along the Bay of Bengal.

Malnutrition and emotional trauma conspire to make refugees even more vulnerable to diseases like COVID-19.

But today it's home to the world's largest refugee camp -acommunity at extreme risk of being devastated by COVID-19.

Some 855,000 people live in the camp, having fled horrific violence in Myanmar. Typically, there are 40,000 people per square kilometer in some places, as many as 70,000!

Entire families have crammed into flimsy, one-room shacks made of bamboo. And countless neighbors are forced to share one water source, waiting in endless lines for latrines. Sanitation and hygiene are abysmal. And that's not all ...

Nearly half of the refugees in Cox's Bazaar are malnourished. And all of them have suffered immense trauma, compromising both their coping skills and their immune systems.

In this desperate situation – where social distancing is impossible - a disease like COVID-19 could have unimaginable consequences.

But because of supporters like you, there is hope!

CARE has worked in Asia for decades and has become a trusted partner to other humanitarian organizations and community leaders.

We've partnered with the health department to minimize traffic in local clinics, while also creating guarantine rooms with extra bedding and mattresses. And we've worked with the government to procure more supplies, including testing kits, in addition to providing handwashing stations and education on sanitation and hygiene.

The refugees of Cox's Bazaar have already experienced so much pain and suffering. With your help, CARE is there to bring them through this current crisis ... and into a healthier, more hopeful future.

World Update

Because of CARE's experience with successfully responding to diseases like Ebola, cholera and Zika, we had the expertise to mobilize communities and activate resources as soon as the threat of COVID-19 was clear:

YEMEN: Following the Ebola epidemic, the country's health systems got stronger. Nearly 30,000 people have received health services from trained workers through the Joint Response Project, and families are nearly three times more likely to wash their hands thanks to education provided by CARE.

SIERRA LEONE: CARE initiatives over the past five years helped improve the national supply chain for critical pharmaceuticals. As a result, health centers are five times more likely to have proper medications for expecting mothers.

THE PHILIPPINES: We used text blasts and social media in this tech-savvy country to reach as many individuals as possible with education and accurate information.

THAILAND: With larger cities in lockdown, we helped get fresh fruits and vegetables from small-scale farmers into the urban centers — protecting health, safety and agricultural livelihoods.

ECUADOR AND PERU: Fighting rumors, myths and misinformation is crucial during a health emergency. Thanks to your support, CARE's efforts have paid off in South America in the time since the Zika outbreak. Today, nearly 98% of people are using factual data from community health systems to understand COVID-19 and protect themselves. And in Ecuador, 89% of women are following best practices to keep themselves and their families safe.
