Yet even such torturous cruelty couldn't keep this chimp a docile performer forever. So, when Thoto got too big to handle, the circus sold him out to the notorious Coulston Foundation, where he entered a waking nightmare.

There, Thoto endured 16 years of untold misery in "The Dungeon" as a medical research subject – before finally being rescued by Save the Chimps.

Thoto is one of many chimps in our care who have been crippled physically and emotionally during their dark pasts. It's on behalf of these – our most needy chimps – that I appeal to your heart today.

"The Great Chimpanzee Migration" – our multi-year effort to relocate the Coulston Laboratory chimps to their permanent home in Florida – is nearing completion.

But <u>without you we cannot continue this great effort until we complete a very unique project</u>, creating a permanent home for special needs chimps like Thoto, Nuri, Scarlett, Clay and others.

On behalf of these abused chimps – and others who wait for you and me to finish this urgently needed project – will you give \$XX... \$XX... even \$XX to help us now?


While most of the residents at our Florida sanctuary live in groups on 3-acre islands, years of exploitation have robbed so many of the ability to live in this setting.

And while 45-year-old Thoto may be brimming with energy and playfulness, a heart condition puts his life at risk – if he's not given a safe, peaceful place for his retirement.

Nuri and Clay have also been brutally marked by years in the lab. With legs permanently disfigured by confinement, Nuri is too scared to join other chimps on the islands.

And years of horror have taken a disastrous toll on Clay – who has been too badly scarred by years of pain and isolation to ever experience the comforts of friendship.

After suffering so very much – humiliation, exploitation, merciless pain and brutal experimentation – these chimps deserve something better.

And they need it now. That's why the Great Migration to loving care and safety cannot continue without your help now!

The renovation of our Introduction Building will finally give all of these suffering chimps the life they've been waiting for – an environment rich with love, play and the dignity to make choices – choices about whether to enjoy the sun or gaze out at the world from inside.

We can't erase the scars. We can't give Thoto back his teeth, can't mend Nuri's legs or reconstruct Clay's harrowing past. But today you can give them a new chance at happiness.

Our chimpanzee friends have been cursed for being so very like you and me. So much has been taken from them for the sake of our curiosity and short-lived amusement.

History: Circus performer, laboratory test subject Special Needs: Thoto is energetic, playful and social, but veterinarians recently discovered that he suffers from cardiac arrhythmia. Thoto needs a safe, calm home where he can interact with friends without becoming overly excited.



Clay, Age: 24

History: Laboratory test subject

Special Needs: Clay was used for invasive, painful biomedical research. Sadly, after such torment and isolation, he is unable to live with other chimps. Clay needs a stimulating home where he can still enjoy the world and the chimps around him.



Nuri, Age: 45

History: Laboratory test subject

Special Needs: With knees permanently bent from years in a small cage, it's difficult for Nuri to climb. Plus, after so many years behind bars, Nuri is frightened and intimidated by island life. She prefers to socialize with friends indoors.



Scarlett, Age: 32

History: Laboratory test subject

Special Needs: Scarlett's two children, Jude and Josi, were taken from her right after birth to be used by the Coulston Foundation. Today she suffers from epilepsy. While medication keeps her seizures under control, she still requires special care.
